Following Jesus is not about doing what he tells us to do or not to do; it is about building a relationship with him. God desires us to have a deep and personal relationship with him. There are many ways to achieve that, and praying is one. God speaks to us through his word, and we talk to him through prayer.

It is difficult for kids to pray if they are not sure exactly what prayer is. So, it is important to help them understand the why and the how of prayer.

Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. (Colossian 4:2)

Why do we pray?

God already knows everything that is happening in our lives, but he wants us to talk to him. Think about your family or your good friends - if you never talked to them, how could you have a good relationship with them? God wants us to tell him our joy, our worries, our desires, our fears and our needs. We can talk to God about everything!

How should we pray?

God does not want us to pray like robots; he wants us to pray with our heart. There is no fixed place, time nor pattern. The key is to spend time with God. Let us continue talking to God, and set the example for our kids to do so as well.

Tips and Ideas on Teaching Kids to

We all know that spending time praying to God each day is one of the crucial elements to spiritual growth and building our relationship with God. And we all agree that it is important to teach and encourage our kids to pray. However, we might struggle with "When do we start asking our kids to pray?" or "How do we cultivate prayer in their lives?" Below are some practical ideas collected from various articles, and hopefully you will find one or two that work for you and your family.

C.H.A.T. with God

Confession – telling God that we are sorry for our sins, the things that we thought, said or did which hurt God or others.

Honour – declaring what we know to be true about God, his characters (e.g. loving, compassion, forgiving, amazing ... etc).

Ask – laying our requests before God, can be for ourselves or for others, for big things or small things.

Thank – saying thankyou to God for what he did, could be answering our prayers or giving us bravery.

Q: What is the biggest challenge in serving at KFC?


A: Perhaps how to continue to nurture God's seeds in very young kids. We need the grace from God.




